

# Milton has produced the best in tennis

TENNIS at Milton is an old sport reaching as far back as September 1929 when the school's first courts were opened. A year later the first tournament was held.

In 1935 Milton won, for the first time, the coveted 'Mim du Toit' Championship and retained the trophy the following year. Since then we have held the title on many occasions. In 1975 we won every match 16-0 including the final and repeated this in 1976.

Throughout the history of the school, Milton has nurtured some of the finest tennis players in the country. Basil Katz played at Wimbledon and his son, Larry, is highly ranked in Zimbabwe.

National champion Peter Wilson has won every major local title while Darryl Lazarus and Dean de Villiers won tennis scholarships to the USA.

Our tennis is very much alive now with Graham Cohen. He is the first Matabele to play at Junior Wimbledon and is seeded in world junior ranking. Earlier this year he won an international tournament in the Ivory Coast, he has played in France and West Germany and is the leading Zimbabwe junior.

other players of note. Patrick Mlauzi is the first black to represent Matabeleland and Warren McDowall plays for the province while Brian Khumalo is a very promising junior.

This season has been most successful with Milton coasting through to the semi-finals of the Mim du Toit after defeating Plumtree and CBC. Milton has a proud record on the courts and the school's potential augurs well for the future.
